~~2012~~ Road Signage Implementation Program:

In order to comply with the sign assessment system required by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), Jackson County will do the following:

It is anticipated that for the first three years that more signs may need attention than can be replaced with available funds. If that is the case the more critical signs will be replaced first.

1st step: Jackson County Road and Bridge has ceased the purchase of any engineer grade signs and sign making materials in 2007. All purchases have been upgraded to High Intensity Grade signs and no signs are replaced or installed that are not of the High Intensity grade. All school bus stop ahead signs have been replaced with the newest version of the Diamond Grade School Bus Stop Ahead.

2nd step: January 1, 2013, Jackson County is preparing to replace all "Stop" signs that are Engineer Grade with the new High Intensity version by the year January 1, 2014.

3rd step: January 1, 2014, Jackson County will begin replacement of all "T" intersection and Curve signs with High Intensity Grade by January 1, 2015. As of January 1, 2015 all Warning Signs in Jackson County will have been replaced from Engineer Grade to High Intensity.

4th step: January 1, 2015, Jackson County will begin replacement of all Advisory Signs with the goal to be finished by December 31, 2018.

5th step: A visual night time inspection program will be implemented as to all signs will be inspected and rated according to the MUTCD for retro reflectivity. Signs that are not legible to the inspector at a typical viewing distance and speed will be listed on the sign inspection form. A copy of this form listing signs needing attention will be filed with the county map for that year. This form will be kept for at least 3 years in a file marked-Night Time Sign Inspection.

6th step: A copy of the sign inspection sheet will be given to a crew to replace the signs and the crew will note the date each sign was replaced. The completed form will be placed in the Night Time Sign Inspection file for that year.

7th step: When signs are replaced the date will be written on the back of the new sign.

8th step: Employees and sheriff's deputies will be instructed to be observant of sign conditions and report any missing, damaged, obscured, or non-reflective signs, object markers and delineators to the Road and Bridge Administrator.

9th step: No Parking signs and any Guide signs with blue or brown backgrounds will be reflective as required by the MUTCD, but are not part of the sign assessment system.

10th step: Once per year an advertisement will be placed in the Holton Recorder requesting residents to report any missing, damaged, obscured or non-reflective signs.
